





Sarnia staff will respond to all complaints of backed-up laterals and establish whether the blockage is on the property owner's property or on City property. Please instruct your staff to have these complaints directed to Sarnia Public Works (519-344-1932), or Sarnia Police (519-344-8861) after business hours, and on-call staff will be deployed.

If Public Works confirms the blockage to be located on City property, appropriate staffing will be mobilized to remove the debris. If the blockage is located on private property, the owner will be advised to contact a plumber. Regardless of the blockage location, the City recommends contacting Ontario One Call at 1-800-400-2255 to conduct a sewer cross bore investigation before entering the lateral.

The City greatly appreciates your co-operation in following this protocol to minimize the impact of these unfortunate circumstances on our residents.

Aim to seek understanding rather than judgement ~ Many people feel that forgiveness is easier said than done. So how do we forgive? The **Cambridge Advanced Learner's Dictionary**, defines forgivable as "*something that you are able to forgive because you understand it.*"

Let Bygones Be Bygones ~ When we learn to understand and accept human imperfections, it becomes easier to forgive the mistakes of others, and our own. People in our lives do the best they know how at the time, and so do we. Forgiveness is conceivable when we learn to let go and strive to do better in our own lives.




