RE: Indian Day School Class Action

Dear Members:

Chief Christopher Plain has been in contact with Gowling WLG (Canada) LLP. They are lawyers handling the class action suit with respect to the Indian Day School. "McLean v Canada is a Class Action lawsuit against the Canadian government for the abuses suffered by students who were forced to attend "Indian Day Schools" across Canada after 1920. This is the first national Class Action seeking compensation for Indian Day School students and their families."

Gowling WLG has agreed to visit Aamjiwnaang for an information meeting. Chief Plain will be providing more information on this meeting as soon as it is available.

If you wish to register for this Class Action database, THE INDIAN DAY SCHOOL CLASS ACTION REGISTRATION FORM must be completed. **The representatives from Gowling WLG, will be able to assist you in filling out the form.**

Dear Members:

On April 17, 2018 Council passed a motion to establish an Access to Fishing Permit. As part of the motion Council committed to revisit the Access to Fishing Permit prior to the 2019 fishing season.

At their meeting held on May 6, 2019 Council reviewed the information provided to them with respect to the 2018 fishing season and passed the following motion with respect to the 2019 Fishing Season:

“That Aamjiwnaang Council acknowledges the Finance Coordinator and Public Works Coordinator joint briefing note with respect to Fishing Permits 2019. Further that, Council is in agreement with Option #3; to eliminate the entire Fishing Permit program and that a Status Card Holder must accompany any non-status member when they are visiting Aamjiwnaang shores to fish.”

Security will continue to take place to monitor and ensure community safety.

NOTICE - Band Members

A section of LaSalle Line will be the site of the annual Sarnia Area Disaster Simulation exercise on Wednesday, May 22, between approximately 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. We urge everyone who is not formally invited to observe the exercise, to please stay clear of the area. This will help to keep response paths clear and help ensure your safety and the safety of everyone participating. No action is required by the public for the drill. Should you hear sirens sounding or see anything indicative of an emergency outside of the exercise hours on May 22, please respond accordingly.

This is part of the coordinated efforts of Chemical Valley Emergency Coordinating Organization (CVECO) members, including local industry and municipalities, as they work together to practice and learn from simulated emergency events. It is part of their ongoing commitment to safety and emergency preparedness.

CVECO falls under the umbrella of the CAER (Community Awareness Emergency Response) organization. The drills are evaluated, and learnings applied to ensure the continued improvement of response by all participants.

"It's all about ensuring the health and safety of our communities – employees, the public, and the environment," commented Vince Gagner, General Manager, CAER/SLEA/IEC.

This year, the scenario, which will be simulated on LaSalle line, bordering the AFN community, involves a westbound partially loaded propane tank truck crashing into an eastbound fully loaded diesel tank. This crash results in pooling propane which ignites, and, as the scenario progresses, the leak evolves into a free-flow of fuel, resulting in a large release to the north side of LaSalle and the adjacent ditch and property.

This scenario will serve to:

Test municipalities' & Aamjiwnaang First Nation's notification capabilities

Test emergency response protocols for propane highway emergency involving fire

Test mutual aid capabilities and compatibilities (unified command)

Emergency preparedness exercises are key in ensuring the capability and preparedness of emergency responders to efficiently and effectively respond to events. By practicing response to simulated incidents, the exercise provides experience and knowledge building for those taking part and helps to identify areas where improvements can be made. CVECO members have been coordinating these drills annually for over 20 years.

"Because in the end, there is no such thing as being too prepared," Mr. Gagner stated.

Who can drive the van?

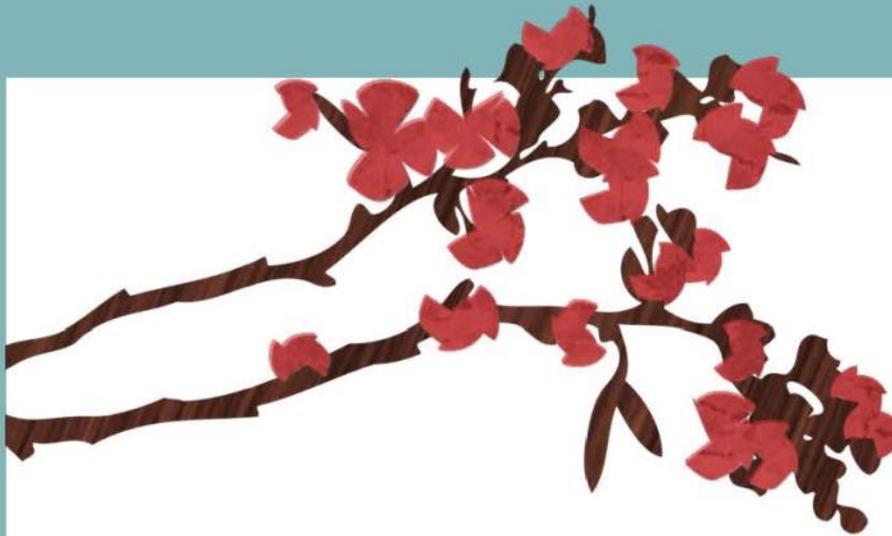
All drivers need to be approved and trained by the Public Works department. If you would like to add a family member or friend as a driver, please contact the Public Works department at 519-336-0510.

2019 Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students



Apply by August 31, 2019

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

The Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students celebrate the hard work and determination of Indigenous peoples who have embraced a **renewed** pursuit of learning. The awards are open to all First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples who have been out of school for one year or more, who have since decided to return to an educational system, and who have now been back at school for at least one year. The Canada Post Awards for Indigenous Students are granted annually to select applicants from across the country, and recipients are awarded \$2,000 in recognition of their efforts.

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE IF...

1. You are Canadian and a member of a First Nation, Métis, or Inuit community.
2. You have been out of school for one year or more.
3. You returned to school and have recently completed one year of studies between January 2018 and August 2019.
4. You have never received this award in the past (previous award recipients are not eligible).

HOW TO APPLY:

1. **Write an essay which details your efforts to get an education.** Be sure to include any challenges you have faced in order to pursue your education, why you were out of school for one year (or more), and what life was like during that time. Your essay should also include the reason(s) you decided to return to school, any extraordinary challenges you might now be facing, and how you're dealing with those challenges. Tell us how your life has changed since you've returned to school and what your next steps will be. Your essay should be typed, double-spaced on letter-sized stationery, and no more than five pages long.
2. **Complete an application form and return it by August 31, 2019.** Be sure to include:
 - Your essay,
 - School transcripts or school letter confirming you've completed one year of studies between January 2018 and August 2019 (photocopy is acceptable), and
 - A clear photocopy of your membership card or an official letter from a community member confirming that you are First Nation, Métis or Inuk.

Applying for your Social Insurance Number

Applying for a SIN with Service Canada

Service Canada has made it easy and secure for you to apply for a SIN, to request a confirmation of your SIN, or to amend your SIN record. When applying in-person, you do not have to complete an application form, nor do you have to mail your **original** proof-of-identity documents.

Documents required to apply for a SIN

You **must** provide **original** primary proof-of-identity documents to prove your identity and legal status in Canada. **Photocopies are not accepted.** You may also need to provide supporting proof-of-identity documents if the name indicated on your primary proof-of-identity document is different than the name you are currently using.

What is a primary proof-of-identity document?

A primary proof-of-identity document is an official document that proves your identity and status in Canada. We need to see an **original** of this primary proof-of-identity document.

Canadian citizens must submit following document:

a **certificate of birth** or **birth certificate** issued by the vital statistics agency in the province or territory where you were born.
