The company issued a Chemical Valley Emergency Coordinating Organization (CVECO) code 9, which means a request for Sarnia Fire Department assistance at approximately 1:42 pm. The fire department used water to suppress vapours on the source of the leak. Ministry staff contacted the company to gather additional details of the leak on April 27, 2020 and followed up with the company on April 28, 2020. The company conducted air quality monitoring along their fence line. There was no detection of contaminants. The Sarnia Fire Department conducted air quality monitoring and found no detection of contaminants. The company isolated the line and completed the repair by approximately 5:00 pm on April 27, 2020. A resident called the Spills Action Centre to report an odour with physical impacts including burning eyes, headache and shaking. According to the Clean Air and Sarnia Area air monitoring network, winds were light and from the northwest. All air monitors were reading in the “good” range. A source of the odour could not be identified.</p> <p>What Actions Were Taken? Ministry staff inspected the area at approximately 12:45 am on April 23, 2020. Ministry staff contacted a facility in the area that is upwind of the area of the complaint and the current wind direction. The company reported normal operations. Ministry staff inspected the area for odour and monitored air quality for volatile organic compounds, sulphur dioxide and hydrogen sulphide in 2 locations, upwind and downwind of the complaint area. There was no detection of contaminants and no odour was detected during the inspection. According to the Clean Air Sarnia and Area website, the winds were very calm and from the North and Northeast. When wind conditions are calm, the wind direction can be variable.</p> <p>What Actions Were Taken?</p> <p>The ministry contacted a company in the area at approximately 9:17 am on June 18, 2020 to ask about potential odours from their site and if there are any activities or issues that could cause the odours. The company confirmed there were no unusual operational issues and checked around their site for odours. No odours were found. The company told the ministry they have found similar odours in one of their buildings when there are certain weather conditions present and they found these odours present on June 16, 2020. Ministry staff inspected the area from approximately 10:30 to 11:00 am on June 18, 2020. No odours were detected. A resident of Stag Island called the ministry’s Spills Action Centre to report a strong chemical odour. A resident of Corunna called the Sarnia District Office to report a strong chemical odour causing burning eyes. According to the CASA air monitoring network, the winds were very light and mainly from the East. When winds are very light, the wind direction is less accurate. All air monitoring stations were in the “good” range.</p> <p>What Actions Were Taken?</p> <p>Ministry staff contacted the resident of Stag Island to gather additional details of the odour. The resident noted the odour was not as strong since his report to the ministry. Ministry staff informed the resident he would contact industries in the area and conduct an inspection to check for odours and conduct air monitoring. Ministry staff inspected the area at approximately 11:30 am. Ministry staff contacted three area industries to check if there were any upsets or activities that could cause the odour. The companies reported no issues with their operations and noted there was manure being spread on Petrolia Line. Ministry staff checked for odours and observed two farmers working the fields and detected a faint manure odour. Ministry staff observed a manure spreader parked on the road closer to Corunna. Ministry staff used hand held air monitoring equipment to monitor for volatile organic compounds and hydrogen sulphide. No contaminants were detected. Ministry staff contacted the resident of Corunna with the results of the inspection. 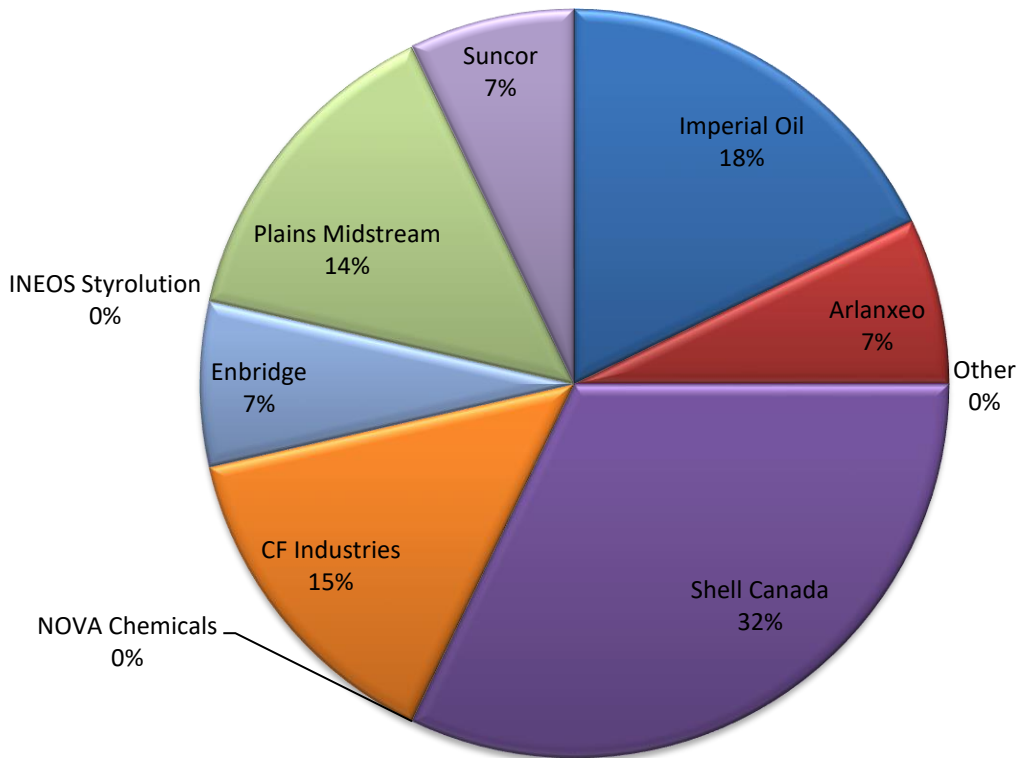

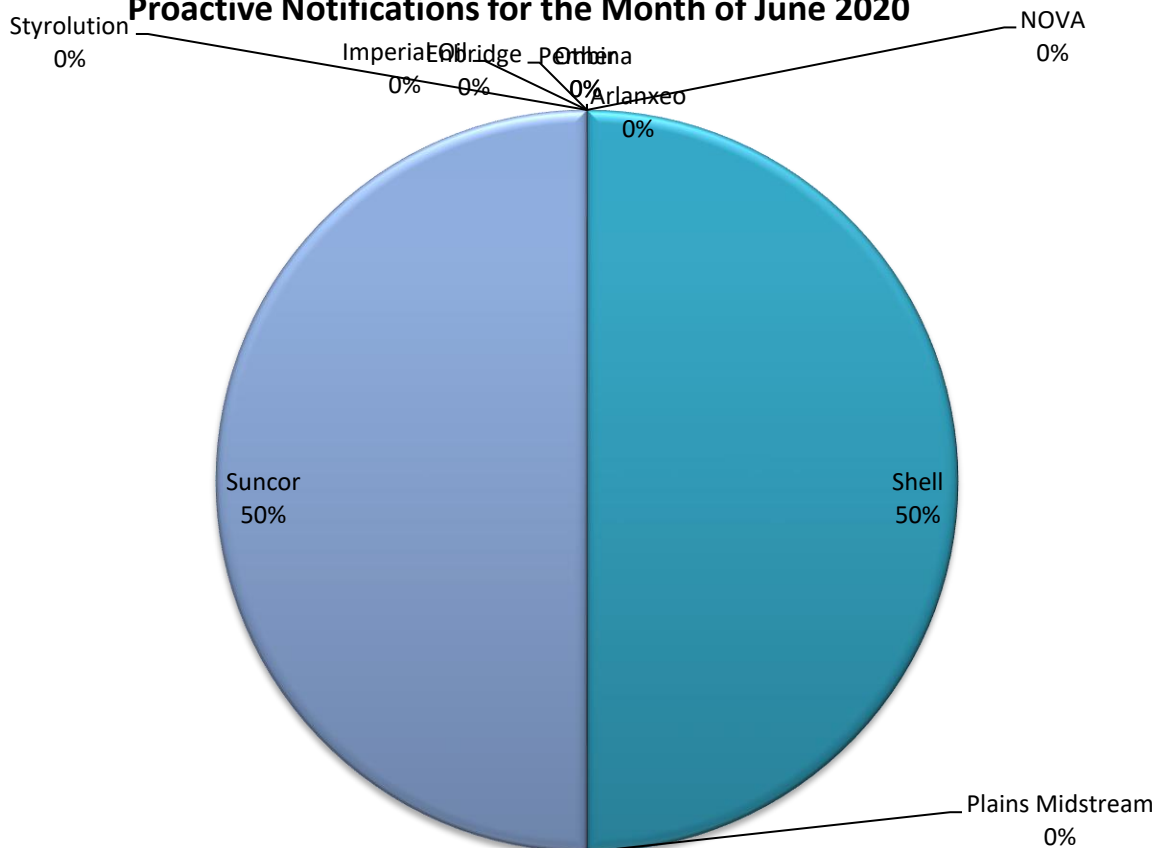

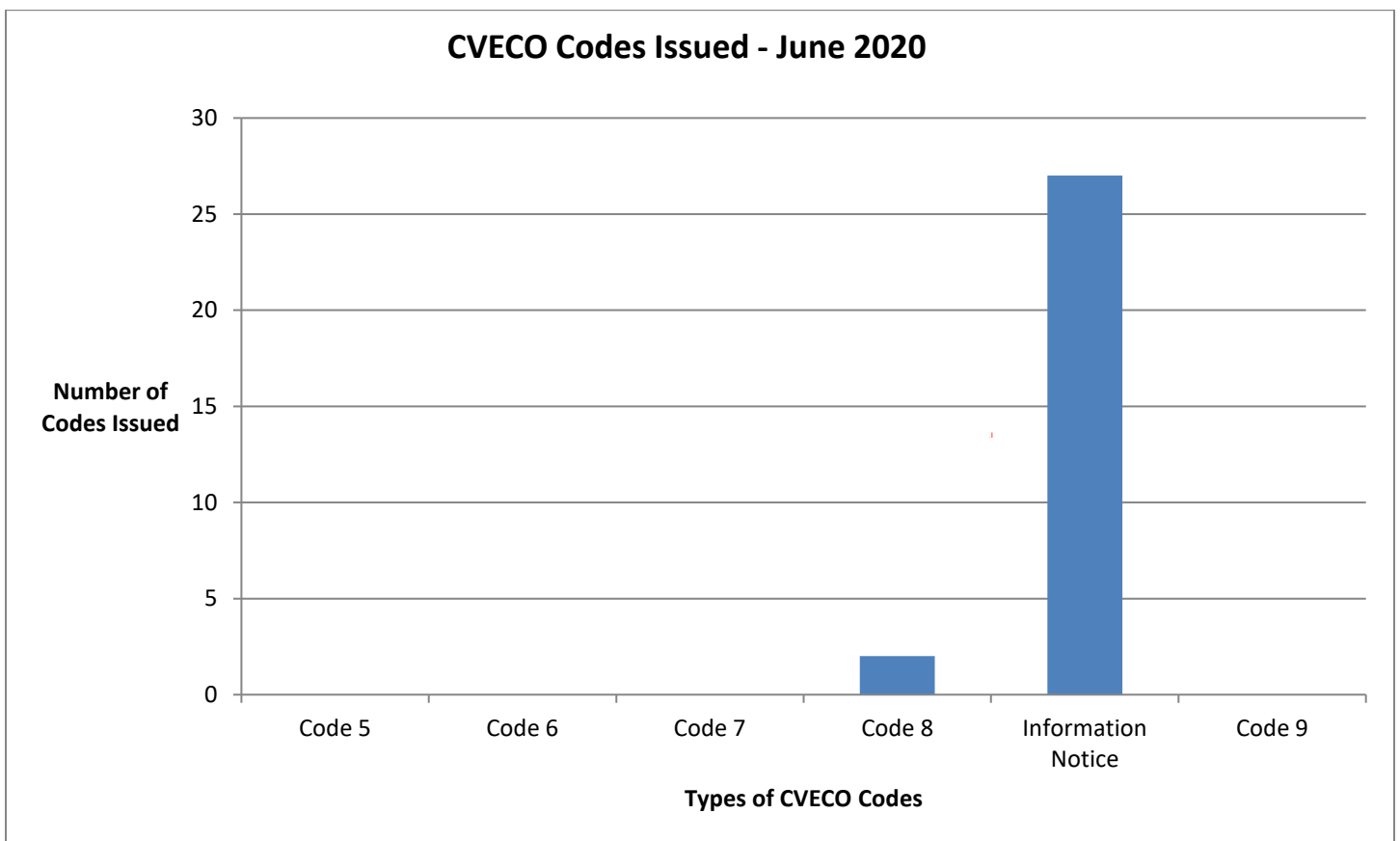
