SENIORS PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program call the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. The program charges a deductible (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a co-payment (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the co-payment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy at the Health Centre, 519-332-6770, ext. 320.

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Electors of the **Aamjiwaang First Nation** will be held at Maawn Doosh Gumig Community Centre, 1972 Virgil Avenue, Sarnia, ON on **Friday** the **26th** day of **August** 2022, beginning at **1:00 p.m.** to **7:00 p.m.**, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the position of Chief and Councillors, on the Band Council of the said Band, for the next ensuing term. There is **one** (1) position for Chief and **nine** (9) Councillor positions available.

The Election will be held at the Maawn Doosh Gumig Community Centre on Friday the **7th** day of **October 2022**.

that any voter may nominate candidates by using a mail-in nomination form. COVID-19 ISOLATION REQUIREMENTS

If you have symptoms or have tested positive for COVID-19

Assume that you may have the virus and may be contagious. Symptoms include:

- fever or chills
- cough
- shortness of breath
- decreased or loss of taste or smell
- two or more of:
 - runny nose or nasal congestion
 - headache
 - extreme fatigue
 - sore throat
 - muscle aches or joint pain
 - gastrointestinal symptoms (such as vomiting or diarrhea)

If you have these symptoms, you **should** isolate:

- for at least five days if you are:
 - **fully vaccinated**
 - under 12 years of age
- for at least 10 days if you are:
 - over the age of 12 and not fully vaccinated
 - immunocompromised
 - live in a highest risk setting

Your isolation period begins the day **after** you noticed your symptoms or the day **after** you received a positive test result – whichever came first. The day you first noticed symptoms or took the test is considered day zero.

If you reach the end of your isolation period **and** have a fever or other symptoms, you must continue to isolate until your symptoms have improved for at least 24 hours (or 48 hours if the symptoms affect the digestive system) and you have no fever.

After you finish isolating

For five days (or 10 days if you are immunocompromised) after your isolation period ends, **you should wear a well-fitted mask in all public settings.**

You can temporarily remove your mask for essential activities (such as when eating in shared space at school/work while still maintaining as much distancing from others as

possible). You can participate in activities where masking can be maintained throughout, but you should avoid activities where mask removal would be necessary (such as dining out).

Once your isolation period is complete you should:

- avoid visiting anyone who is immunocompromised or at higher risk of illness (for example, seniors)
- not visit or go to work in any highest risk settings

If you live with someone who has symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19

You **do not** need to isolate if one of the following applies to you:

- you have previously tested positive in the last 90 days and do not have symptoms
- you are over 18 years old and have received a COVID-19 booster dose and do not have symptoms
- you are under 18 years old and are **fully vaccinated** and do not have symptoms

Instead for 10 days after exposure:

- self-monitor for symptoms
- wear a mask and avoid activities where mask removal would be necessary
- do not visit anyone who is at higher risk of illness, such as seniors, or any highest risk settings (unless you previously tested positive in past 90 days)

If you do not meet any of the criteria above, you must isolate while the person with symptoms/positive test result isolates (or for 10 days if you are immunocompromised).

If you've been exposed to someone from another household with symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive test result

You are required to:

- **self-monitor** for symptoms for 10 days after your last exposure
- wear a mask, avoid activities where mask removal is necessary (such as dining out, high contact sports) and follow all other public health measures if leaving home
- do not visit any highest-risk settings (such as long-term care or retirement homes) or people who may be at higher risk of illness (such as seniors) for 10 days after your last exposure

Position Title: Education Support Worker (Jordan's Principle) (2 Positions Available)

Location: Sarnia, ON

Duration: permanent, 35 hours/week, 10-month contract

Tentative Interview Date(s): August 29th & 30th, 2022

Position Summary:

The Education Support Worker provides 1:1 and other classroom support to Aamjiwnaang students to achieve their full potential and academic success. Assists the classroom teacher with curriculum for special education needs, acts as a liaison between school and families. Works under the supervision of the special education department.

Responsibilities:

1.0 Direct Support

- Provide 1:1 academic support to identified students in the classroom and around the school
- Prepare daily supports for students to create independence for special education needs.
- Review and implement goals of Individual Support Plans for students
- Charting and data tracking
- Assisting classroom teacher with creation of materials, resources and supports for student success (visual schedules, sequencing boards, structured learning bins).
- Work with Resource Teacher for observation and assessment of student progress, providing feedback to staff
- Utilize Applied Behavioural Analysis (ABA) strategies and universal supports for students
- Executive functioning support for students (organization at the beginning and end of day)

2.0 Community Liaison

- Responsible for enhancing communications between parents/guardians and teacher/school officials.
- Riding the school bus or shuttle with student as required
- Extra-curricular support for students with special education needs

3.0 Other

- Cleaning for health and safety (sensory, class manipulates, learning tools)
- Always maintain a professional code of conduct

- Promote and maintain positive communication and working relationships with students and school personnel.
- Participate in school-based team meetings and monthly staff meetings
- Supervision before and after school as needed
- Participate on ongoing training and professional development.
- Work requirements may change depending on student and school needs and flexibility of assignments may be necessary.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Strong organizational skills
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Exhibits a high degree of initiative and self-direction; ability to work in a group setting.
- A passion for working with young children and empathy for the needs of students.

Requirements:

- Post-Secondary diploma in Child and Youth Worker, Development Disabilities, Educational Assistant

Impact of Error:

Errors in judgment and performance could cause high-level student frustration and could detrimentally impact the individual growth of students. When having trouble in the schools, reach out to the school administration to ensure conflicts are resolved and positive relationships are maintained.

Other Considerations:

In accordance with Section 16 Special Programs of the Canadian Human Rights Act, preference will be given to Aamjiwnaang Band Members with relevant education/experience (R.S.C 1985, c. H-6, s16 (1-3)).

Application Process:

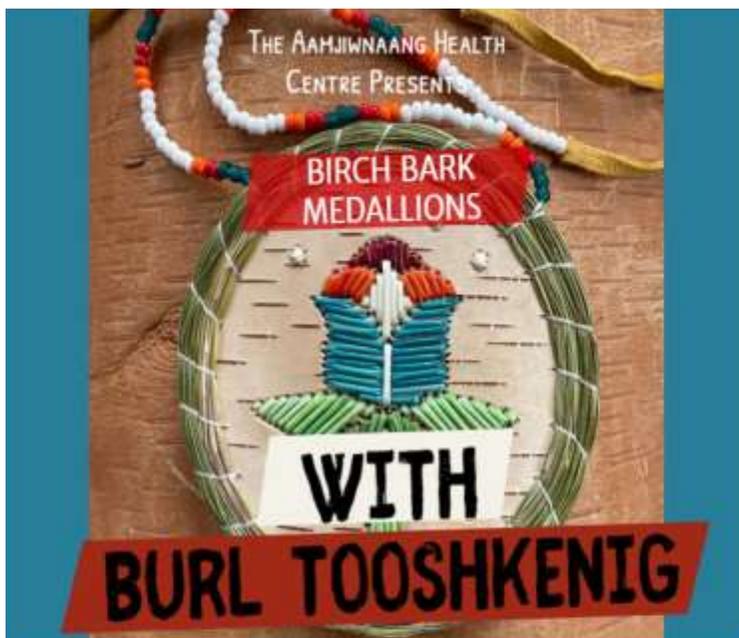

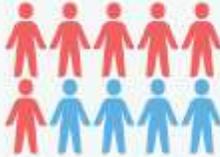


WHAT IS CHRONIC ABSENCE?

Ontario elementary schools have 194 days of school per year. Students who miss 19 days of school or more (10%) are considered chronically absent.



CHRONIC ABSENCE AND HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT RATES



A recent study found that students who missed an average of two days per month in elementary school stood a 60% chance of dropping out in grade nine.

QUICK FACTS

According to Charity Intelligence, if a student misses 2 days of school each month from grad 1 through grade 9, by grade 10 that student will have missed an entire year of school.



School attendance is critical to student's academic success, but more importantly, research shows that low performance at school generally leads to a more difficult life with less access to good jobs.



AAMJIWNAANG ELEMENTARY

For the 2021/2022 school year chronic absence among Aamjiwnaang public elementary students was reduced from 27% in semester 1 to 10% in semester 2!



EQAO

When absenteeism is correlated to student achievement, there is a direct relationship to achievement on the EQAO assessment for students in grades three and six.



KINDERGARTEN

Research indicates that absenteeism in kindergarten is associated with negative grade one outcomes, such as; greater absenteeism in the future, and lower student achievement in math, reading, and general knowledge.

The Blended Delivery PSW Certificate Program will be delivered over 34 weeks, which includes 3 in-person sessions of 2 weeks each in Kettle Stony Point - a 3 week Long Term Care (LTC) Practicum, location TBD. The program includes practicum hours in both community (in the student's home community) and a Long Term Care partner facility. Upon completion of the program, graduates will receive a SE Health Career College Certificate and will be prepared to work in a variety of practice settings including home support, assisted living, residential/complex care, special care units, other home and community care settings and acute care.

- Program Location (In-Person Sessions) Kato and Stony Point First Nation

- Students will be required to attend in person sessions during the 34 week program. The intakes are:
 - 2 weeks at the start of the program (in-person #1)
 - 2 weeks in the middle of the program (in-person #2)
 - 2 weeks at the end of the program (in-person #3)
 - 3 weeks for the LTC Practicum
- Student Selection Selection is done via a formal application process, based on the application information, results from the English Literacy test, and evidence of community support.

Spring home maintenance & tips

- Check furnace and air exchanger filters. Clean or replace filters when they are dirty.
- Test the smoke detector and replace the battery.
- Check the fire extinguisher pressure gauge. Get extinguisher re-charged if needed.
- Inspect the basement for signs of water leakage.
- Check the siding and outside of your home for winter damage.
- Clean any debris from the eaves trough and downspouts. Reattach any sections that are loose.
- Inspect the grade and landscaping for property damage.
- Inspect windows and doors for operation and screens for needed repairs.
- Inspect foundation walls for cracks and leaks.
- Check furnace and air exchanger filters. Clean or replace filters when they are dirty.
- Check the chimney for and wood-burning appliance at the end of the heating season.

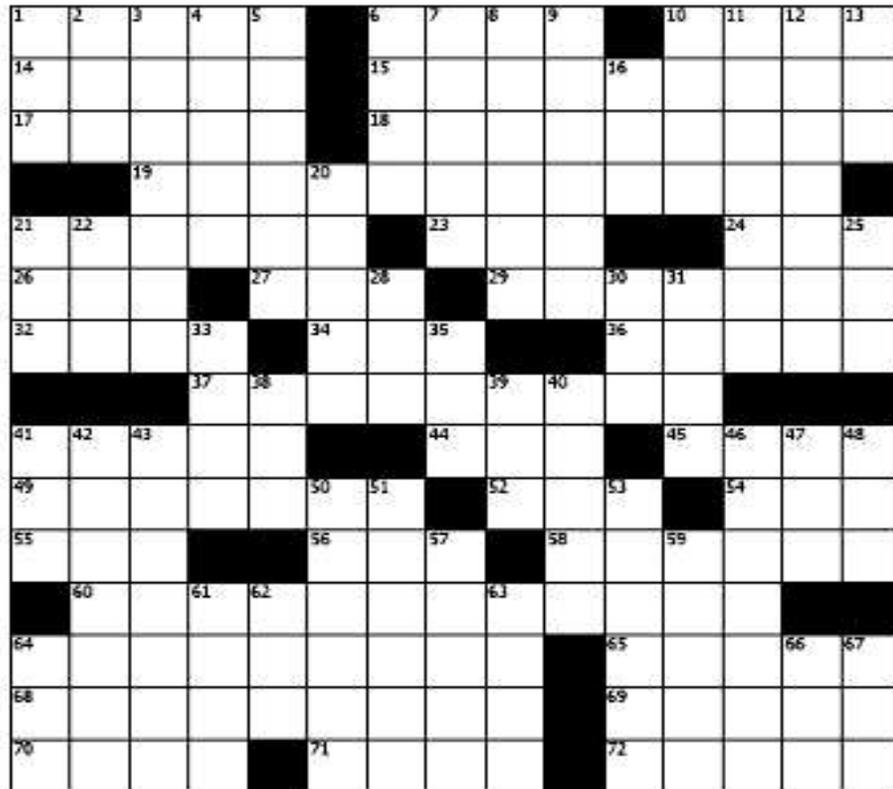
