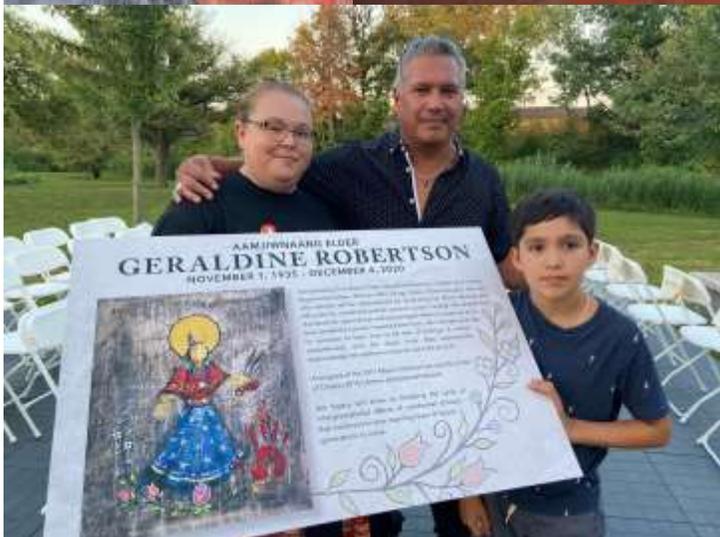

SENIORS PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program call the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. The program charges a deductible (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a co-payment (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the co-payment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy at the Health Centre, 519-332-6770, ext. 320.

Position Summary:

The Child Care Centre Casual Cook is responsible for daily preparation of nutritious meals and snacks served to the children (ages 6 months to 5 years). The kitchen is to be managed by staff in strict compliance with Health Department, and Child Care Early Years Act and all other applicable legislation. The Cook Assistant works in consultation with the Early Learning Centre Supervisor to ensure the smooth operation of the kitchen and its coordination with the other program of the centre.

Responsibilities:

- Preparing of lunch menus and snacks in accordance with the Canada Food Guide and Indigenous Food Guide; posting of menus for parent and staff.
- Assist with unpacking and checking orders as needed.
- Deliver and collect lunch/snack trays to/from all on-site classrooms.
- Complete clean up and disinfecting after each meal (i.e., dishes, countertops, garbage and recycling, etc.)
- Ensure kitchen and practices are in compliance with the Ministry of Education.

Other

- Attend staff/program meetings as required.
- Attend professional and other relevant training opportunities as required (i.e., proper food handling).
- Participation in special events as assigned by the Early Learning Centre Supervisor.
- Assist the Supervisor in maintaining a safe and healthy work environment by promptly reporting existing and/or potential workplace hazards.

Blended Delivery Offering

SE Health, through our SE Career College of Health, is pleased to announce that we will be offering an intake of the Personal Support Worker (PSW) Certificate Blended Delivery (BD) Program for Aamjiwnaang First Nation Home and Community Care Program. This program has been developed to support students who wish to minimize the time required to leave community and family to complete PSW training. The program offers the best of face-to-face and virtual (online) education training.

The Blended Delivery PSW Certificate Program will be delivered over 34 weeks, which includes 3 in-person sessions of 2 weeks each in Kettle Stoney Point , a 3 week Long Term Care (LTC) Practicum, location TBD. The program includes practicum hours in both community (in the student's home community) and a Long Term Care partner facility.

Upon completion of the program, graduates will receive a SE Health Career College Certificate and will be prepared to work in a variety of practice settings including home support, assisted living, residential/complex care, special care units, other home and community care settings and acute care.

Virtual instructor lead computer training prior to start of the PSW Course

- Program Location:(In-Person Sessions)
Kettle and Stony Point First Nation
- Tuition and Travel Costs
Provided by Ontario First Nations and Inuit Health Branch (FNIHB) Home and Community Care Program (HCCP).

Students will be required to attend in person session during the 34 week program. The timelines are:

- 2 weeks at the start of the program (In-person #1)
- 2 weeks in the middle of the program (In-person #2)
- 2 weeks at the end of the program (In-person #3)
- 3 weeks for the LTC Practicum
- Student Selection:
Selection is done in a formal application process, based on the application information, results from the English Literacy test, and evidence of community support.

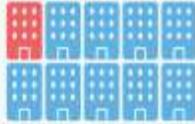

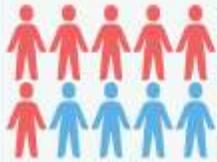


WHAT IS CHRONIC ABSENCE?

Ontario elementary schools have 194 days of school per year. Students who miss 19 days of school or more (10%) are considered chronically absent.



CHRONIC ABSENCE AND HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT RATES



A recent study found that students who missed an average of two days per month in elementary school stood a 60% chance of dropping out in grade nine.

QUICK FACTS

According to Charity Intelligence, if a student misses 2 days of school each month from grad 1 through grade 9, by grade 10 that student will have missed an entire year of school.



School attendance is critical to student's academic success, but more importantly, research shows that low performance at school generally leads to a more difficult life with less access to good jobs.



AAMJIWNAANG ELEMENTARY

For the 2021/2022 school year chronic absence among Aamjiwnaang public elementary students was reduced from 27% in semester 1 to 10% in semester 2!



EQAO

When absenteeism is correlated to student achievement, there is a direct relationship to achievement on the EQAO assessment for students in grades three and six.



KINDERGARTEN

Research indicates that absenteeism in kindergarten is associated with negative grade one outcomes, such as: greater absenteeism in the future, and lower student achievement in math, reading, and general knowledge.

Spring home maintenance & tips

- Check furnace and air exchanger filters. Clean or replace filters when they are dirty.

Predeceased by his parents Douglas Simon (1989), Millie Shobway (1996); his father-in-law Alex Neshinapaise (2010); his daughter Dawn Star (2003); his nephews Warren Jr (1999) and Jordan (2019), his nieces Jodi (1989) and Melissa (2007); and his brother Clyde (2019).

A proud member of the Aamjiwnaang First Nation (formerly of Summer Beaver), Dwight's life travels have taken him across Turtle Island, gaining experience and skills along the way. Dwight shared stories of his past which included his passion for hockey, ice skating and coaching. He enjoyed and took considerable pride in crafting handmade earrings. Dwight was quite an intellect and sought out any opportunity to share and discuss his life work and political ideas, some quite complex. He was quite proud of his publications including "Indigenous Cultural Perspective Resolving Freudian Theory and the Maslow Paradigm." It was Dwight's hope to create an improved holistic healing and learning paradigm to help his fellow Anishinaabe people toward political autonomy through self-governance. Dwight made the 2020 Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) Non-fiction Prize longlist. Dwight is now free to skate in heaven!

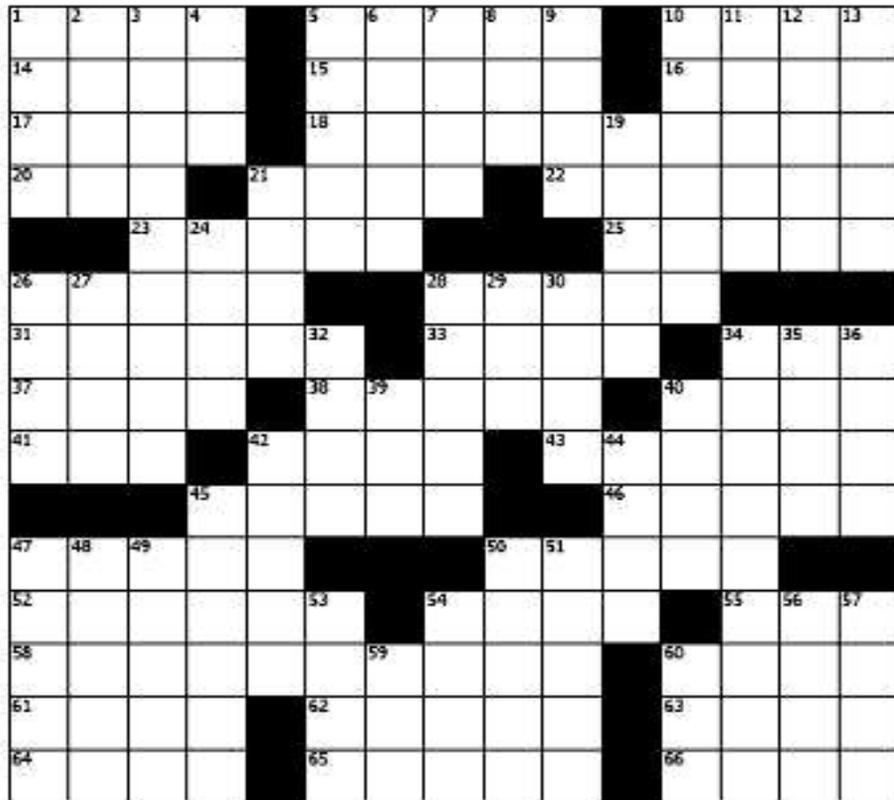

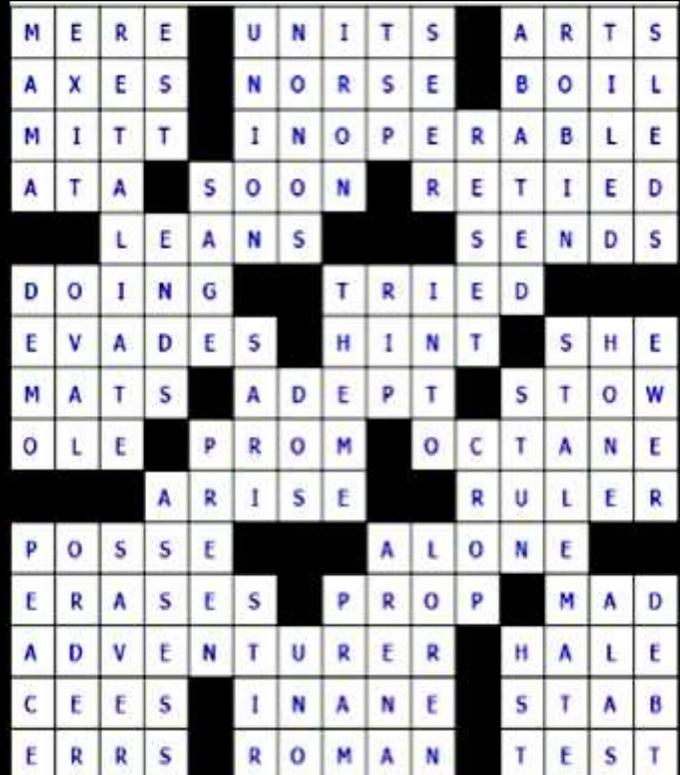
