## SENIORS PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program call the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. The program charges a deductible (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a co-payment (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the co-payment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy at the Health Centre, 519-332-6770, ext. 320.

**If you have respiratory or gastrointestinal symptoms, you should self-isolate** until you have no fever and your symptoms have been improving for 24 hours (or 48 hours for nausea, diarrhea, or vomiting). This will reduce the spread of COVID-19 and other respiratory and gastrointestinal illnesses.

**You must also take additional precautions for 10 days** from the start of your symptoms.



- Wear a well-fitted mask in indoor public settings (including work, school, and childcare).
- Avoid activities where mask removal would be necessary, including dining out and practicing/playing sports where masking cannot be maintained.
- Do not visit anyone who is at higher risk of illness, such as seniors. Note that some disabilities are invisible, and do not assume that others are low risk.
- Avoid non-essential visits to highest risk settings. Highest risk settings are hospitals (including paramedic services), home and community care, congregate living, long term care and retirement homes, First Nation elder care lodges, group homes, shelters, hospices, correctional institutions, Provincial Demonstration schools, and hospital schools. Please contact a specific organization if you have questions about their policy.

**Self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19.**

According to federal travel requirements, children aged 5-11 who are unvaccinated and have returned from international travel in the past 14 days must wear a mask in all indoor public settings (including schools), even if exempt from quarantine.



## SENIORS HOME MAINTENANCE & REPAIR

The Home and Community Care Program has access to additional one-time funding to assist seniors with minor home repairs. The focus is on repairs or modifications needed to address or prevent health and safety issues in the home. The overall goal is to help seniors maintain independence in their own homes.

### Eligibility

- On-reserve band members ages 55+
- Homes needing minor renovation or repair to address or prevent health and safety issues
- Privately owned or Band owned homes
- Up to \$5,000 per home. One-time only. Exceptional circumstances may be considered.

### Process

- Homeowner will submit application form and two (2) quotes to the Housing Department. Inspections to help determine the scope of work are encouraged and can be scheduled through the Housing Department.
- Applications will be reviewed and approved by a team made up of Health, Housing & Public Works/Maintenance.
- Applications will be approved on a first-come, first-served basis until the funding is exhausted
- Inspections are mandatory once work is completed and will be required to issue payment.

Eligible Items – including but not limited to:

### Interior Repairs & Modifications

- Install safer flooring
- Grab bars and handrails
- Install safer tub or shower
- Raised toilet seats
- Replace smoke & carbon monoxide detectors
- Faucet & fixture leaks
- Improved or motion-activated lighting
- Home safety improvements
- Accessibility modifications
- Ramps and other mobility aids
- Mold remediation

### Exterior Repairs, Upgrades & Maintenance

- Deck maintenance and repair
- Install timers, outdoor security and path lighting
- Exterior caulking
- Minor driveway repairs
- Clearing hazards from yard, garage, basement
- Repairing leaks

The Child Care Centre Casual Cook is responsible for daily preparation of nutritious meals and snacks served to the children (ages 6 months to 5 years). The kitchen is to be managed by staff in strict compliance with Health Department, and Child Care Early Years Act and all other applicable legislation. Effective November 15, 2022

#### The Role of First Nation Representatives:

Section 188 (5) of the *Education Act* allows for a regulation to provide First Nation representation on school boards. Regulation 462/97, First Nations Representation on Boards, lists the conditions for appointing First Nation Trustees, provided a tuition agreement is in place. These are:

- When the lesser of 10 percent of the students of a board or 100 students are from First Nations communities, the First Nations communities may name, and the board must appoint, one representative. That person is deemed to be elected to the board.
- When 25 percent of the students of a board are from First Nations communities, the board may appoint a second representative.
- When the First Nations student number is fewer than the lesser of 10 percent and 100, the appointment of the First Nation representative is at the discretion of the board.

The role of all Trustees is to help create the vision and set the strategic direction that will guide the board and its schools. As the representative of the First Nations community on the school board, the First Nation Trustee is in a unique position to ensure that the Indigenous culture is part of that vision, and that the strategic direction of the board includes the interests of the First Nations community.

#### Representation:

Under the Education Act, the Lambton Kent District School Board (LKDSB) may appoint one representative from the four First Nations - Aamjiwnaang, Chippewas of Kettle & Stony Point First Nation, Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) and Walpole Island First Nation - Bkejwanong Territory.

The First Nation Trustee is a full voting member of the Board, and will work with elected Trustees, Student Trustees, and members of Senior Administration. The LKDSB has schools located in urban and rural communities throughout the Municipality of Chatham-Kent, the City of Sarnia, and the County of Lambton.

This progressive system has 62 elementary and secondary schools, approximately 24,740 students, approximate total staff of 3,400 and a budget of approximately \$315.17 million.

**Responsibility of the First Nation Trustee:**

The First Nation Trustee is responsible for:

- monitoring the negotiation of the tuition agreements;
- ensuring that the actions of the board reflect the tuition agreements;
- ensuring that both parties of the agreement are fulfilling their obligations;
- ensuring that mechanisms are in place for effective accountability to the First Nations community;
- ensuring that racism and harassment are not part of the First Nation students' experience at school.

**Responsibilities of all LKDSB Trustees as per Section 10 the LKDSB Procedural By-laws - Section 10 Role of Trustees**

The responsibilities of Trustees are defined in the Education Act and include but are not limited to:

- a) establishing and monitoring Board policy;
- b) implementing Provincial education policy;
- c) establishing a budget and monitoring its implementation;
- d) providing, equipping and maintaining schools;
- e) holding the Director of Education accountable for student achievement and student well-being;
- f) employing and compensating staff;
- g) accountable to ratepayers;
- h) advocating public education;
- i) ensuring the effectiveness of Board programs and services.

Trustees are expected to attend Board Meetings and serve on Board committees and keep confidential all information discussed in Private Session. Trustees are expected to follow the School Board Member (Trustee) Code of Conduct for the Board.

The First Nation Trustee is also to encourage the involvement of the parents and the First Nations community in the First Nation students' education. To redress the legacy of residential schools and advance reconciliation, the Truth and Reconciliation Chair, the Honorable Justice Murray Sinclair stated, "Education got us into this mess and education will get us out of it". He underlines the importance of the involving parents and community members in student learning and supporting their success.

Tuition agreements also provide for First Nation representation on school councils and the LKDSB Special Education Advisory Committee. The LKDSB Indigenous Liaison Committee provides a forum for discussing Indigenous education issues. The First Nation trustee is the co-chair, and membership includes a representative from each of the First Nations communities that have students in the LKDSB schools.

**Qualifications:**

Trustee candidates need not have a background in education.

- Band member of one of the Four First Nations - Aamjiwnaang, Chippewas of Kettle & Stony Point First Nation, Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) and Walpole Island First Nation - Bkejwanong Territory
- At least 18 years old.

**Length of Term:**

The Term is four (4) years in length effective November 15, 2022.

**Trustee Honorarium:**

Trustees are entitled to receive an honorarium for each year of the term beginning on November 15, 2022, as outlined in the LKDSB Regulations *Trustee Honoraria*.

**Allowable Expenses:**

Trustees are entitled to claim expenses related to Board business, including travel to Board and Committee Meetings, approved attendance at conferences as per LKDSB Regulations on *Expense Reimbursement for Staff, Trustees and Student Trustees and Attendance of Trustees and Student Trustees at Educational Conferences, Workshops and Related Events*.

Allowable expenses include preapproved travel, accommodations at conferences, meals, long distance telephone calls and supplies.

**Selection Process:**

Each of the four First Nations will submit the name of their candidate to the Four First Nations Education Association who will then select one to be named as the appointed representative and a second as alternate. Each First Nation will then submit in writing, to the LKDSB, naming the appointed representative and alternate. The LKDSB will then appoint the representative as the First Nation Trustee (and alternate) representing the four First Nations. The Public Sessions for LKDSB meetings are open to all community members.







### Spring home maintenance & tips

- Check furnace and air exchanger filters. Clean or replace filters when they are dirty.
- Test the smoke detector and replace the battery.
- Check the fire extinguisher pressure gauge. Get extinguisher re-charged if needed.
- Inspect the basement for signs of water leakage.
- Check the siding and outside of your home for winter damage.

- Inspect foundation walls for cracks and leaks.

- Check the chimney for and wood-burning appliance at the end of the heating season.


