Dental, Drugs, Medical Supplies & Equipment, Medical Transportation, Vision Care, and Short-Term Crisis Intervention Mental Health Counselling.

Using you Benefits: When you present your status card to any health provider, as if they bill directly to NIHB before obtaining the service. Ensure the health care provider verifies that the product/treatment is an eligible benefit listed on NIHB

Be Aware: If you are asked to pay upfront, it can take 6-8 weeks to be reimbursed, and you may not get reimbursed if the benefit was not pre-approved. You may want to seek out a provider that does bill directly to NIHB. The Drug or product may be an exception benefit requiring the provider to call the Drug Exception Centre at 1-800-580-0950

### Occupation Sensor

Occupancy sensors detect the presence or absence of people and turn lights on and off accordingly. This could reduce your lighting usage by up to 15%



## Replacing old lighting with, LED bulbs

Changing your lights out for an LED equivalent can reduce lighting energy useage by up to 65%

This IESO Save on Energy program has provided funding for 4 community buildings to recieve lighting upgrades including the Band Office, Binoojiinyag Kino Maagewgamgoons Early Learning Centre, E'Mino Bmaad-Zijig Health Centre, and Maawn Doosh Gumig Community and Youth Centre.



Energy data was collected from each eligble community building to create a Benchmark Report, which recommended that these 4 community buildings would benefit the most from lighting upgrades to reduce long term energy costs.


