

Good day Aamjiwnaang Community Members,

I wanted to take the opportunity to share with all of you the different ways that I can be reached.

If there is an emergency situation or a crime in progress always call 9-1-1. For non-emergency assistance, dial 519-344-8861 on your telephone. The Communications Centre (dispatcher) will contact me by radio if I am working and I will respond. If I am not working at the time of the call, another officer from the Sarnia Police Service will respond and I will have access to the information and follow up with you if required.



If I am not working and your preference is to have me attend at a later time, please let the dispatcher know and the call can be assigned to me when I return to duty.

The SPS has also recently introduced online reporting in an effort to make it easier for the community to report incidents. These reports will be viewed by a police officer who will follow up with you if required.







THE CALL: Clean Harbors is holding a competition to award 6 Indigenous artists (2 Metis, 2 First Nations, & 2 Inuit) the opportunity to provide artwork that will be used to wrap a Clean Harbors semi-truck (Clean Harbors Reconciliation Awareness Truck Project). This dedicated truck will travel around Turtle Island in a transport capacity and may also be seen at truck shows and in the media.

THE PURPOSE: Clean Harbors acknowledges that we are on Indigenous lands wherever we live and work. We are invested in reconciliation and working together with Indigenous peoples to support a sustainable future for all. Through this Project and with the support of our Marketing and National Transport divisions, we have the unique ability to work with Indigenous artists to create a travelling billboard dedicated to educating others across Turtle Island of the positive meaning of reconciliation and encourage those we meet along the way to meaningfully invest in reconciliation, as individuals and as businesses.

THE VISION: Our vision for the Clean Harbors Reconciliation Awareness Truck Project includes the following options:

- Six (6) art submissions blended to create a mural which would be used to wrap the sides of a semi-truck (3 submissions/side)
- An orange feather on each sideview mirror of the truck
- An image of a pair of children's moccasins at the foot of each door with the caption "Every Child Matters"
- Clean Harbors Indigenous Canadian/Native American Employee Resource Group logo (as shown above) on the hood of the semi-truck
- Clean Harbor's logos changed to orange (our standard is red)
- Unveiling and Indigenous community-led ceremony on September 30, 2023 at a location to be determined in Canada
- Postcards/Pamphlets provided to the driver of the Clean Harbors Reconciliation Awareness Truck that will be used to inform people of the meaning of the artwork and the journey of the truck

CLEAN HARBORS INTENDED LISE OF ART:

- Six (6) art submissions incorporated to wrap the sides of a semi-truck (3 submissions/side)
- Artwork submissions may also be added to educational material (i.e.: postcards or pamphlets) that would be distributed by the driver of the truck to provide information about the artists, the meaning of the truck, and the meaning of reconciliation

- Submissions accepted will be photos of illustrations (drawing, painting)
- Artwork provided must have a white background
- Orange will be used as the primary colour
- Artwork will include the Artist's signature in black in the bottom right corner
- Artwork will signify and communicate positive messaging about meaningful reconciliation
- Submitted artwork will not depict any violence or negativity. (The purpose of the vision and messaging is to encourage positivity)
- Submitted artwork will not include wording, other than the artist's signature
- Artists will be required to provide a brief bio to accompany their artwork. Biography use will be limited to
 communications about the Project
- Artists understand they will be asked to sign a release permitting Clean Harbors to use artwork as described prior to fee distribution. (Artists will retain ownership of the original artwork)
- Artists may be contacted by external communications/media companies for interviews as a direct result of their
 participation in the Project. Artists are under no obligation to Clean Harbors to accept/deny these opportunities if
 presented

TOXIC IMAGES: VISUAL REPRESENTATION OF INDUSTRIAL CONTAMINATION AND FRONTLINE COMMUNITIES



A research project proposal from Laurence Butet-Roch, PhD Student, Environmental Studies, York University

WHY IS THIS PROJECT BEING DONE?

This project explores how people living in Aamjiwnaang First Nation feel about photos of their communities that have been published in Canadian news publications. The overarching objective of this study is to determine how best to bear witness to the harms of industrial contamination and advocate for environmental justice without perpetuating stereotypes and damaging narratives. More specifically it seeks to:

- 1. Create useful and practical tools to encourage reporters to adopt the recommendations identified throughout the research project and conduct their work in a better way.
- Shift public perceptions of Aamjiwnaang by encouraging local and national news publication to move away from damage-centered reporting and emphasize that it is a vibrant community that deserves to be protected through the enactment of appropriate environmental legislations.
- Allow Aamjiwnaang community members to further their awareness of how their community is represented in mainstream news publication and address the discrepancies they observe.
- 4. Further develop the critical visual literacy of Aamjiwnaang community members and give them the tools to determine how they want to be portrayed in the media and to ensure that their wishes are respected.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN THIS STUDY?

This study involves two 2-hours workshops and one hour and a half workshop. You can choose to participate in any or all of them. During the first, you will be asked to draw or write on existing photos of Aamjiwnaang First Nation and share how you feel about how Aamjiwnaang First Nation is portrayed in Canadian news publication. The second will focus on devising and designing a way to let Canadian news publication know how you wish they would interact with and depict Aamjiwnaang First Nation. The third will ask you to review the dissemination materials and provide feedback. You are free to opt out of any workshop activity at any time or choose not to respond any of the prompts.

WHO IS THE RESEARCHER?

I'm a documentary photographer from Tiohtià:ke/Montreal currently living in Tkaronto/Toronto, and a PhD Student in Environmental Studies at York University. My relationship with Aamjiwnaang First Nation dates to December 2010, when I was invited by to assist in a Photovoice project. Since then, I've continued to visit multiple times a year, building strong relationships with various community members, and working on a photographic essay about the community. In 2016, I was invited to organize and activity at the Enviro-Day fair, where community members wrote and drew on some of the photographs I made. This became the inspiration for my research project.

WHEN AND WHERE WILL THE WORKSHOPS TAKE PLACE?

ARE THERE ANY RISKS?

There are minimal risks to you in this study. You will be asked to look at and comment on photos of Aamjiwnaang, which sometimes depict the community in a less than favourable light, which can be upsetting, distressing, and demoralizing. You will also be participating in group activities with other participants, during which you might disagree with the opinions of others. To facilitate these conversations, we will build a space based on mutual respect and understanding. You are also free to opt out of any workshop activity at any time or choose not to respond any of the prompts. And, there will be a separate space with food and beverages if you feel like you need a break.

WHAT ABOUT BENEFITS?

If you agree to take part in this research, there may or may not be direct benefits to you. You will grow your awareness of how Aamjiwnaang First Nation is represented in mainstream news publication and develop your critical visual literacy, as well as your ability to communicate with journalists. You will also receive a 50\$ honorarium for your participation in the form of a gift certificate. Food and beverages will be served. Reimbursement or arrangements for transportation to and from the community centre will be offered.

WHAT ABOUT CONFIDENTIALITY?

You can choose whether to keep your identity confidential (I will give you a pseudonym), or to have your identity included in the study. You can inform me of this decision at any time during the research. And you will have the opportunity to review any of the materials pertaining to you before it is made public.

WHAT WILL YOU DO WITH THE WORKSHOP MATERIAL?

I will analyse the results of the workshops as part of my PhD research, some of which may be included in my dissertation, future publications, and conference presentations. We will also work together to design ways to share best practices with local and national journalists.






