

### Cultural Centre Project Community Update

The AFN Cultural Centre Project was included in the 2018-20 Band Council Work Plan as it had been identified as a priority in past and current Community Comprehensive Plans. In June of 2019 AFN Council gave the Development Department directive to establish a Project Team and undertake the development of the building design.

Since June of 2019 the Aamjiwnaang Cultural Centre Project Team has been working with Burkhart Gilchrist Architects Inc. (BGAI)on the Cultural Centre Project and the following is a breakdown of the work that has been completed on the project, to date, to ensure the building truly reflects Aamjiwnaang's rich culture both past and present.

- Request for Proposals (RFP) were issued to three architectural firms to undertake the design process; Burkhart Gilchrist Architects Inc. was the successful bidder.
- From June 2019 to September 2020 the project team collaborated to develop a design concept that was approved by Chief and Council.
- From October 13<sup>th</sup> 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 the Conceptual Designs were presented to the Community at five Engagement Sessions that were held with seniors, knowledge keepers/elders, artisans, youth, and the general community.
- From the Engagement Sessions a Community Consultations for Proposed Cultural/Multipurpose Centre Project Report was completed which raised issues with the building design, regarding display items and artifacts inventory, and cultural programming.
- In January 2021 Council put the project on hold and directed the Project Team
  to assess the cultural services and programs offered in the community, available
  grant funding, listing of other cultural centres and their programing offered, a
  list of AFN cultural resource persons, and projected budget for building costs.
- In April of 2021 the Aamjiwnaang Cultural Services and Program Report with recommendations was presented to Chief and Council.
- In June of 2021 Chief and Council gave approval to amend BGAI's contract to complete pre-design work which included a Programming Brief Report that provided an approximate building size and high-level square foot construction cost estimate for the project to be shovel ready.



### What are lice?

Head lice are small insects that live and breed among human heads and feed on small amounts of blood from the scalp. Head lice are a common problem, especially for school aged kids. Head lice can be a nuisance but not a health hazard and do not pose danger.

Lice are specialized to live on human heads and can only live for a short time away from one. They don't live anywhere else on the body, or on any other animals.



Head lice are hard to see because they are small and can hide in the hair and come in various shades of brown and grey. Adult lice are about 1-3 mm long and they lay eggs (called nits) and the nits are usually pale in colour and about 1 mm in size.

### Prevention



Do not share hats, brushes/combs, or other personal items.



Comb through your child's hair thoroughly each week to remove lice before they lay eggs and settle in.



Tie long hair back when going to school to help prevent lice from spreading.



Check your child's hair regularly for head lice, especially if there is an outbreak at school or after sleepovers.



Wash all bed linens, stuffed animals, and clothing in very hot water (130°F [54.4°C]), then put them in a hot dryer cycle once a week.

## How did my child get lice/nits?

Head lice spread easily from person to person, and sometimes are tough to get rid of. Lice cannot hop, jump, swim, or fly - they spread through direct contact. Head-to-head contact is



common during play at school, at home, and elsewhere including sports activities, playgrounds, slumber parties, and camping. Head lice can also be spread through sharing pieces of clothing such as hats and scarves. Your child also may contract head lice from sharing items such as hair accessories and hair brushes!

### Treatment

Treating headlice requires two treatments, one week apart:

- Get a headlice shampoo, cream rinse or lotion from the pharmacy and complete two treatments, one week apart (NIHB will cover the treatment with a prescription from your provider, but make sure they give you 2 for two treatments). \*be sure the shampoo you chose is safe for your child as there are shampoo treatments that are not recommended for children under 2 years of age or with certain allergies
- Check all household members for lice. If there are multiple household members with lice, treat everyone the same time to prevent reoccurrence.
- Soak all combs, brushes, helmets, hats, etc. in hot water (130°F [54.4°C]) for at least 20 minutes.
- Wash items such as scarves, hats, pillow cases, bed linens, towels and stuffed animals in hot, soapy water (130°F [54.4°C]) and dry in hot dryer cycle.
- Store any difficult to wash items in an airtight plastic bag for 2 weeks.
- Combs through your child's hair with a fine-tooth comb on wet, conditioned hair to remove the rest of the lice and nits. Some treatments are not 100% effective, and sometimes do not completely get rid of the lice.






