Attention Community Members,

We hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather that has arrived. As many of us begin working on our gardens and enjoying outdoor activities, it's worth reminding people to be mindful of off-road vehicle activities and of other members of the community and follow the below restrictions.

- The cemetery and walking paths behind the baseball diamond have been and continue to be improved for us as a community to enjoy, not for off-road vehicle use.
- Remain off the bike bath on River Road and Tashmoo Avenue, which is permitted strictly for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Follow all locally posted speed limits, as well as all stop signs and other street signs.

With recent events in the community that cause further concern of safety, we encourage people to report concerns to the correct avenues. Whether that be the Sarnia Police or writing a letter of concern to the correct department. One of the many beautiful assets we have as a community is our knowledge of activities and our acute sense of awareness for one another. If you see something that may impact safety, please report it.

For community awareness, that last year we spent over \$10,000 to address the over population of cats that have made their way to Aamjiwnaang. That included treatment for fleas, rescue operations, transferring to shelters/ homes, as well as spray/neuter services. We encourage pet owners to please take advantage of the Pet Wellness Clinic opportunities for your pet. Some services will be available in May, see the Aamjiwnaang tribune for further information. The Spay/Neuter service will be available in the fall.

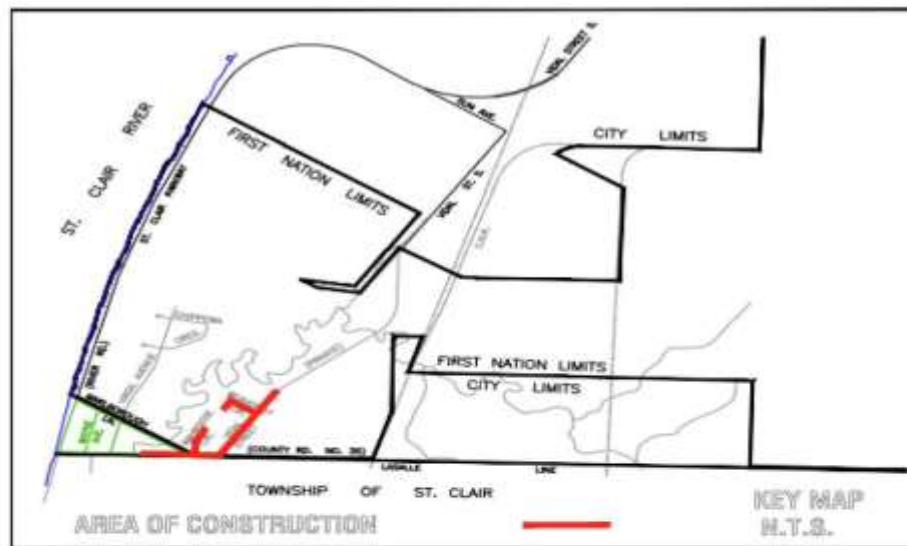
Re: Contract 8-2025 – Vidal Street Watermain Phase 2

Property Owners, Merchants and Tenants,

The City of Sarnia is proceeding with the watermain installation and reconstruction of Vidal Street South, starting north of Beaver Circle to LaSalle Line, and LaSalle Line between Vidal Street South and 214 LaSalle Line, beginning in the spring of 2025. The project was approved by City Council and awarded to Birnam Excavating.

Construction Phasing

Work is expected to commence at the beginning of May 2025 and the project will proceed in phases of construction. The anticipated completion date is the end of September 2025. Please note that phasing is subject to minor changes and overlap as the contractor and the City of Sarnia work together to realize efficiencies to complete the work. The work will begin on Vidal Street South, approximately 250m north of Beaver Circle and then proceed down Vidal Street South and LaSalle Line to 214 LaSalle Line.



Water Temporary

The work will include an overland temporary water system to minimize disruptions to your water supply. This overland piping is tested to Ministry of the Environment standards prior to being placed into service and will be tied into your existing water service piping at the property line. The temporary watermain allows the contractor to keep residents in service while removing and replacing the existing watermain below the road.

Scope

The driver of the project is the replacement of a watermain due to its condition. The entire construction limits of the above streets will require the installation of a new watermain and connections to the existing services. Also included will be the rebuilding of the road with new asphalt. The new roads will be built back in approximately the same location. While the work is in progress, there will be several periods when local traffic and through traffic are interrupted. The contractor will limit this disruption as much as is possible. Residents are advised that there will be periodic water disruptions and advanced notice will be provided.

Parking

While the work is in progress, there will be several periods when local traffic and through traffic are interrupted. It is recommended that when the work is in your area that you park on adjoining side streets or an adjacent phase. You must still park in a legal zone facing the proper direction.

Garbage and Recycling

Your garbage and recycling should go out to the curb as usual on your regular day. Birnam Excavating staff will arrange to have it picked up by the City's collection contractors. This may involve moving bins to a different part of the job. Please ensure that garbage and recycling is out by 7:00 am of your collection day and that bins are secure and clearly marked with your address.

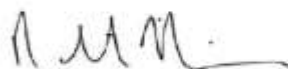
Pre-Condition Survey

During road construction it is quite common to experience vibration due to heavy construction and compaction equipment. Prior to the start of construction, a pre-condition survey of your property is recommended for insurance purposes and will be conducted on all buildings within the limits of construction, with the permission from the owners. Please note that Birnam Excavating has contracted OZA Inspections LTD, a loss prevention consultant, to conduct a pre-condition survey as a requirement of their contract with the City of Sarnia. OZA Inspections LTD, staff will be contacting you to schedule an appointment.

The time required to complete a survey varies due to the size and type of the building but typically takes less than 1 hour to complete. The inspection will involve documenting the existing conditions of the exterior and the interior of each home or business within the limits of construction. Homeowners are assured that all information is kept confidential and referenced only for confirmation of existing conditions prior to the reconstruction works being undertaken.

There will be no special assessment or charges to the property owner for the cost of this contract or the work affecting your property. Re: NOTIFICATION OF PIPELINE MAINTENANCE WORK NEAR VIRGIL AVENUE

Background: Plains Midstream Canada (PMC) has several pipelines that traverse Aamjiwnaang. These pipelines have been in place for several decades and portions of the pipeline system are located near Virgil Avenue and by daycare. As part of routine infrastructure maintenance PMC often must dig up segments of the pipe to check and perform necessary repairs to keep the pipeline operating safely.

Project Overview: PMC intends to conduct integrity digs on an existing pipeline (please see the Area Plan below for excavation locations). As a part of PMC's commitment to working with the public the following information has been provided to demonstrate PMC's intentions maintain and safely operate the pipeline in accordance with the Canadian Energy Regulator (CER).

Odours and Emissions: No extensive odours will be associated with normal maintenance operations; emissions will be limited to standard construction and excavation operations.

Traffic: There will be an increase in vehicular traffic in and around the area when construction is underway. During normal operation vehicular traffic will be minimal and will be as required for operations and maintenance personnel to access the pipeline. PMC plans to avoid daycare drop-off times.

Noise: During construction there will be an increase in noise levels from the pipeline ROW due to vehicular traffic and construction equipment.

Emergency Response Plan (ERP): The activities carried out will be in accordance with PMC's Corporate ERP.

Project Schedule: Construction will begin in the third week of May and extend for a period of about six weeks.

HOUSING UPDATES

- 8-Plex Construction:** Work began in November 2024, with an estimated completion date of August 2025. This building will include four 4-bedroom units and four 3-bedroom units with finished basements and 2 bathrooms.
- Micro-Subdivision:** Planning is underway for a micro-subdivision behind the Tashmoa apartment buildings. It will consist of 17 houses on small lots. Staff are actively working to secure funding.
- Christopher Drive Subdivision:** The Housing Department is working with the Manager of Community Services on the initial planning stages for a 75-lot subdivision on Christopher Drive.

Housing Allocation Process:

Units are currently allocated through a lottery system to ensure a fair and unbiased selection process. Housing staff and the Finance Coordinator review and score all applications, and those who qualify are entered into the lottery.

Due to community concerns regarding the current selection process, we are seeking input from community members on potential improvements. All suggestions will be presented to the Housing Committee. If a new allocation process is adopted, community members will be notified, and the changes will be incorporated into the Housing Policy.

The Sarnia Police Service (SPS) is one of just two municipal police forces in Ontario tasked with policing a First Nations community. The Aamjiwnaang Heritage Cruiser is the result of a community-driven initiative, co-created by Chief Derek Davis and Julie Craddock, former deputy chief of SPS. Both the Aamjiwnaang First Nation Chief and Council played a key role in selecting the design, which was crafted by Aamjiwnaang member Aaron Plain.

Titled “The Keeper”, Plain described the design as an evolution that started as a dream and developed into a story. “The warrior on the left side of the truck symbolizes someone who sacrifices for others, while the woman on the right side represents the strength, spirit and life-giving power of women,” said Plain.

“A community relations vehicle is one place where designers can run wild. Sarnia uses bold colours and designs that differ from side to side to significant effect here,” said Brown.

Exclusively driven by the Aamjiwnaang Community Officer, the vehicle serves as a culturally sensitive resource for the Aamjiwnaang First Nation, helping to foster a harmonious, healthy community.

Aiken praised the design for embodying the community’s vital caretaking role, which also aligns with the core mission of the police service. “It’s beautiful, a true representation of the values both the community and the service uphold.”

Chief Davis emphasized SPS’s deep respect for the Aamjiwnaang community, noting, “We acknowledge the privilege of serving Aamjiwnaang First Nation and value them as partners in public safety. Recognizing and meeting the unique needs of the Aamjiwnaang people is a central goal of our service.”

After securing third place in the 2024 Best Dressed Frontline Patrol category, Davis expressed that winning the 2025 Community Relations category was “beyond expectations”.

“As a medium-sized agency with fewer resources than larger forces, this recognition is especially meaningful. It reflects on the quality of our people and their innovations, along with our ability to implement new projects and programs, despite our constraints,” said Davis.

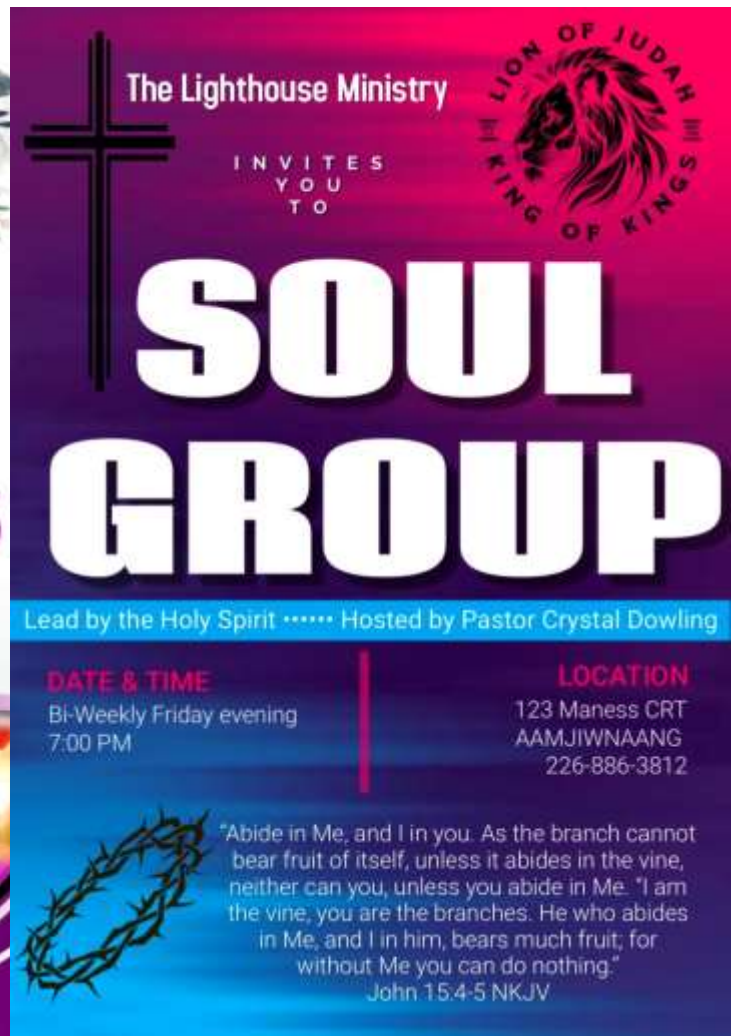
