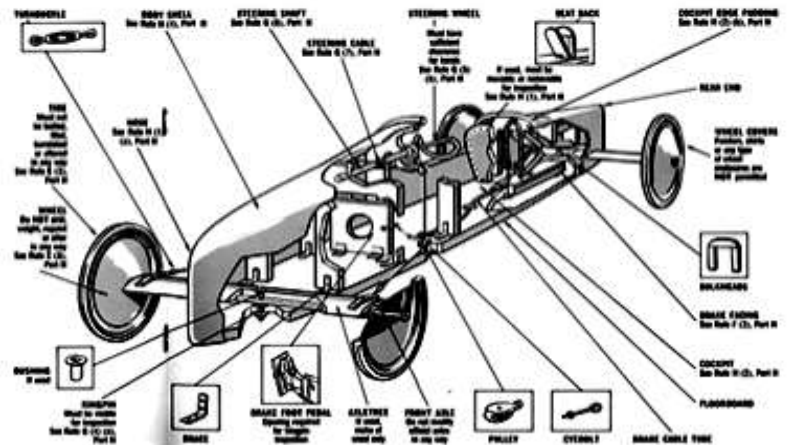
Soapbox Derby Time Trials

Hey Aamjiwnaang!!

We want to try something new for the Fall Fun Fair this year, and we thought this would be a fun and great way to encourage some good ol' fashioned indigenous ingenuity. No motors or screaming radios, but maybe a lot of duct tape to hold it all together!

Basic Rules for the Derby:

Vehicle Rules -

- Must be solely gravity powered. No other forms of energy or propulsion are allowed.
- Cars have only 1 driver, you may have a pit crew of 3-4 people. Pit Crew can only push the car as far as the start line.
- Cars must have functioning steering and braking capabilities. Must be able to stop within the short space after the finish line. Doesn't have to have a sharp turning radius but must be able to navigate the course without assistance.
- Must have at least 3 load-bearing wheels (No one- or two-wheel vehicles)
- Must have a floor, not just foot pegs so as to protect your feet and knees.
- Size is limited to 8 feet in length, 4 feet in width and we ask that it not exceed 350lbs combined weight with the driver
- Car must not have any sharp edges, either inside or outside, to avoid harm to the driver and others.
- Cars may be shared with other drivers.
- Cars visuals must remain at a PG level, no nudity or profanity and no politics or candidate advertising.

Racer Rules -

- Each racer must wear a helmet (bicycle helmet is ok) and make sure it is properly strapped on.
- Each racer must wear eye protection (glasses or a helmet shield)
- Each racer must wear elbow and hand protection. (leather, canvas or gardening gloves and a jacket are acceptable)
- Knee protection is advised but not mandatory.
- Racers must not wear open-toe shoes. No sandals or flip-flops, slides or slippers. Proper footwear is required.

Other notes of interest --

- Cars may be made of wood, metal, stone, plastic or whatever your can imagine as long as the vehicle is safe and doesn't exceed the weight limitations.
- Any weights or balancing instruments used must be firmly attached to the car to avoid creating dangerous projectiles.
- Thin wheels and well oiled bearings are optimal; no hard plastic wheels as they do not grip to the surface as well as rubber and can potentially slide on curves or steering.

UNDERSTANDING INDUSTRIAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE IN SARNIA-LAMBTON

In Sarnia-Lambton, emergency response is a collaborative effort that ensures public safety and environmental protections are top priorities. There are two types of notification systems community members may be familiar with. Public notifications through the Sarnia-Lambton Alerts system are intended to advise the general public of an issue, while the Regional Industrial Codes system is used internally by emergency responders. The following is a breakdown of how the different types of notifications are structured to meet the needs of two very different audiences.

Regional Industrial Codes	Sarnia-Lambton Alerts
Area residents have likely heard terms like Code 6 or Code 10 before, but what exactly are these codes used for? The Regional Industrial Codes system was developed to allow industry to share information with municipal and emergency response teams, and BASES industrial members. The codes help responders assess an incident and determine if additional resources or support is needed.	Sarnia-Lambton Alerts is a mass public notification system used by local municipalities and BASES industrial members to share information with the community for both non-emergency and emergency events.
This system is non-mandatory, and it's used only by BASES members; however, it remains an efficient tool for improving response capabilities and adhering to regulatory requirements. The emergency responders that use this code system meet regularly to review incidents, plan emergency response training, and share learnings. This type of ongoing collaboration and relationship-building is essential to a strong response structure. As former Community Awareness Emergency Response (CAER) member George Hatfield once said, "It's not an old saying in emergency response, make your friends before you need them".	This free subscription-based service allows subscribers to customize the types of notifications they want to receive and the method by which they're received (i.e. email, mobile app, text, phone) in the event of a widespread emergency requiring public action - such as a driving water emergency or a shelter-in-place/evacuation advisory - a priority alert would be sent to subscribers by the local municipality* with detailed information and instructions.
The Regional Industrial Codes are not intended for the general public. Instead, a system called Sarnia-Lambton Alerts provides the broader community with plain language information.	To make sure they receive this information, community members can sign up for Sarnia-Lambton Alerts by visiting www.sarnialambtonalerts.ca or downloading the Eventbrite app to a mobile device.
	*Sarnia-Lambton Alerts is currently used by the City of Sarnia and its car towers and is accessed or used in other surrounding municipalities in the E.C.R. for more information on receiving emergency alerts outside the City of Sarnia or St. Clair Township, please contact your local municipality.

BASES industrial members are committed to maintaining transparency and trust with the community. By understanding the difference between internal Regional Industrial Codes and Sarnia-Lambton Alerts public notifications, residents can better understand how emergencies are managed while staying informed with accurate and timely updates.

Everbridge Code Title Change

This communication is to inform all parties of an upcoming change to the Code notification process. As part of BASES' continuous updates and organizational restructuring, it was identified that when Codes are issued by BASES members and distributed by Sarnia Police Dispatch, the title currently appears as "CAER Code #". Since CAER is no longer a legal entity, it is important that our systems reflect our current organization and structure.

This change is not intended to erase or diminish the long history and contributions of CAER in the Sarnia-Lambton region. It is simply to align our systems with where we are today as an organization.

In the coming days and weeks, we will begin transitioning the title from "CAER Code #" to "Industrial Code #". As this transition will take some time to complete, you may still see "CAER Code #" used for certain codes during the interim.

BASES plans to have this change fully implemented and effective as of July 15th, 2025.

Position Summary

The Building Maintenance Supervisor is responsible for providing routine and preventative maintenance to identified Aamjiwnaang First Nation Band Buildings and Property and ensuring the execution of high-quality services in alignment with the policies and procedures established by the First Nation Council. The Building Maintenance Supervisor provides supervision to direct reports, including the cleaning team. The Supervisor is responsible for supporting coordination of warm, welcoming, and inclusive building maintenance services, while working with and supporting individuals, families, and connecting with the Aamjiwnaang community.
