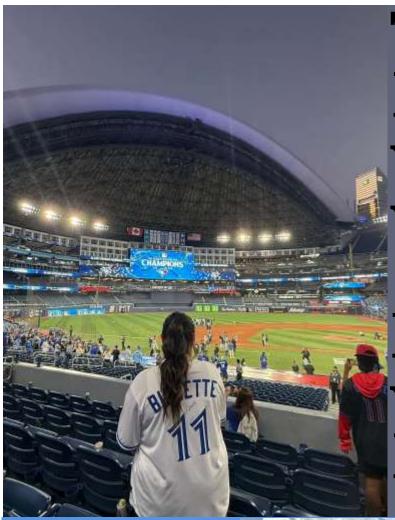

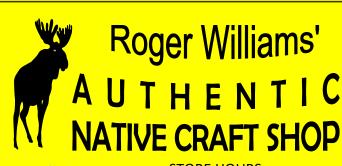

As an EarlyON Culture and Language Educator you will work directly with Early ON Worker, Head Start Worker, and HB/HC program to provide traditional knowledge activities in the programs for children 0-6 years old and their families. You will report to the Healthy Babies Healthy Children Coordinator.

### Responsibilities

#### Main Duties:

- Introduce Anishinaabemowin words and phrases in play-based learning programs.
- Acting as a resource for parents, other staff, and service providers.
- Provide Anishinaabemowin culture activities through language circles, crafts, singing songs, dancing, finger plays, story telling, cooking and other age-appropriate activities.
- Offer weekly parenting programs -September to June.
- Offer parenting program series 3-4x/year such as Circle of Security, Traditional Family Parenting, Infant Massage, etc. (training provided).
- Provide traditional knowledge workshops for parents monthly.
- Assist in developing and piloting a fathers and child play based learning program and father workshops.
- Assist in pilot of summer blanket program in community.
- Integrate Elders into programs to share traditional understanding and cultural practices.
- Plan land based and cultural activities for children and parents.
- Shop for, prepare and serve nutritional snacks and meals.
- Gather statistical data for reporting purposes.
- Responsible for acquisition of teaching materials and equipment necessary to run an educational and stimulating program. Responsible for maintaining accurate records of all expenses related to the EarlyON Program.

### Position Summary:

Shelter Support Staff provide support to shelter residents during the evening, overnight, and weekend hours. A general summary of responsibilities includes providing a safe, clean environment, supporting, and assisting guests residing in shelter, and documenting any safety/security concerns or rule violations.

### Responsibilities:

- Provide support and crisis intervention through harm reduction approaches, culturally safe and traumainformed care.
- Ability to provide resource information for individuals and families we serve.
- Communicate necessary information to outreach staff to keep them informed.
- Follow and enforce guidelines, and policies with shelter guests.
- Support and assist guests with their shelter needs as they arise (ex. questions, concerns, hygiene supplies, cleaning supplies, bedding, food and more).
- Ensure the privacy and safety of other guests by not confirming the identity of other guests, and by not allowing anyone other than guests, staff, case workers or law enforcement on the premises.
- Maintain the cleanliness of shelter through performing light housekeeping tasks.
- Complete proper documentation; intake, health check (eg. Needs a mask, wounds, etc.), logs, shift notes, referrals, etc.
- Attend regularly scheduled meetings.
- · Maintain positive, supportive, and respectful guest and colleague relations.
- Support our guests with non-judgment of lifestyles and struggles.

### Qualifications:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Post-secondary school ideal. Experience working in shelters and the field of mental health and addictions an asset. Lived experience an asset.
- Strong organizational and communication skills.
- Ability to establish and maintain professional boundaries while working with clients.
- Experience in crisis intervention and problem solving with the ability to diffuse situations.
- Ability to work overnight including weekends.
- High level of understanding and practice of trauma-informed care, harm-reduction approaches, and cultural safety.

# PSALM 37:4 Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.



Boozhoo, Hello Aamjiwnaang First Nation. My name is Karen Taylor and I am from beautiful Walpole Island First Nation; presently I reside in the scenic town of Wallaceburg. My adult sons name is Jordan; he will fulfill the purpose and destiny of God for his life. My Saviour has opened a door

for me as an educational assistant, working for a school board. Jesus said, "I have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it." Jesus Christ was talking about opportunity.

Some of you reading this may have known my daddy Lennox Taylor and know my momma Helena. With the love and support of his wife, my dad served the LORD in the role of a pastor for over thirty years at the Walpole Island Evangelistic Centre. My faith is built on the solid ground this church helped me to find in Jesus Christ, and this is true as well: Israel is the foundation of the land where my faith began. In other words, Israel is the foundation of my faith (and yours, if you are a born again believer in Jesus Christ).

It has been five years since daddy went to his eternal home in heaven; Lennox heard his, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant." One of the many things dad taught me was how to use a concordance in the bible. As we were on our way to a church service, dad was driving and he asked me to go to the concordance in the bible and look up the word loved. I found the word loved and he asked me to name off the Scripture references listed beside that word. I did. As I did that he would say, "No, no, no.," until I said, "John 3:16." After that, I think he said, "That's the one, what does it say there?" It says: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." This is one of my favourite verses in the Bible, and to this day, I still use a concordance.

God did something in June 2025. He appointed me as assistant pastor to Pastor Crystal Dowling, the head pastor of the Lighthouse Ministry, here in Aamjiwnaang First Nation. I was made aware of the fact that it was five years ago, from the date of my ordination, that Pastor Crystal had been ordained. God's timing is perfect!

At one point, Pastor Crystal and I were talking about how we met; we could not recall how. I think it may have been at a camp-meeting hosted by former Pastor, Larry Gilbert at the Walpole Island Evangelistic Centre. Larry is also in his eternal home in heaven, and he too has heard his, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."

God has given Pastor Crystal a vision for The Lighthouse Ministry. I am in tears as I write this. If I had a vision it would be for the salvation of souls from sin and its consequences. It would include discipling nations to walk in Love, and seeing others surpass me as a leader. This is my vision.

In Jeremiah 29:11 (King James Version) it says, For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end.

The New Living Translation puts it this way: For I know the plans I have for you," says the LORD. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.

I strongly encourage you to believe in the LORD God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper.

May the LORD bless you, and keep you: The LORD make his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you: The LORD lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace. May the Name of the LORD be upon you forever. Amen and Amen.

Pediatric Occupational Therapy is a healthcare service that helps children develop the skills they need to participate in daily activities, or "occupations," such as playing, learning, and self-care.



Motor coordination – is the ability to use different parts of the body together smoothly and efficiently to do an activity. It involves the brain, muscles, and joints all working as a team to control movement—like catching a ball, riding a bike, or using scissors.

Infant Motor Skills- the abilities an infant develops to control their large and small muscle groups to perform everyday movements and tasks

Fine motor skills – improving hand and finger movements, like holding a pencil or doing up buttons

Learning strategies –
helping children stay focused,
follow instructions, and
succeed at school

Sensory processing – helping children handle things like loud sounds, textures, or movement in a way that feels more comfortable

Feeding and swallowing – creating an optimal eating environment, improve oral motor function, develop fine motor skills for utensils, and manage challenging behaviors, thereby increasing a child's ability to feed and swallow safely and independently.

Self-care skills - learning to dress, brush teeth, use the toilet, and more

Visual Perception – helping kids make sense of visual information (like puzzles, shapes, and letters)
